A Week of Hope is a personal setting of about 100 youth...ideal for getting to know everyone. Service projects might include preparing meals for the elderly, serving disadvantaged children, or small home-repair projects. Over 5 days, your group will build meaningful relationships with those they serve, those they serve alongside, and most importantly, a deeper relationship with Jesus.

Service is the very fabric of the Week of Hope experience. In addition to serving the community, students will take turns preparing meals and cleaning the facility where they will live with other youth groups during the week. Throughout the week, students are continually serving others: both people in the local community, and one another.

Programs are led by well-trained staff leaders - but students will have the opportunity to serve by leading worship music and other parts of each worship program (feel free to bring guitars, drums and great voices!).

### You'll enjoy projects like:

- Supporting local food banks
- Playing a game with an elderly person
- Helping to lead a day camp for children
- Landscaping homes, non-profits, and ministries
- Working with disabled children
- Serving a needy resident
